

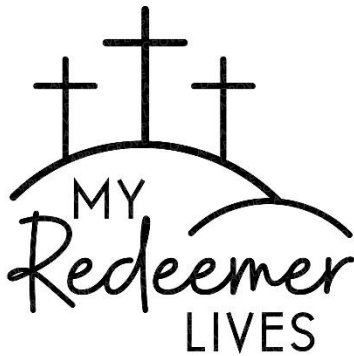

Its sting is lost forever. Alleluia! Alleluia!

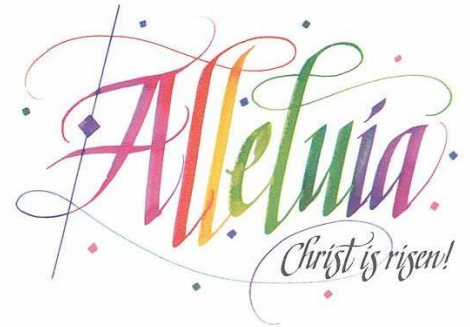
It was a strange and dreadful strife When life and death contended.

Member Ministry Corner



Spiritual Growth Is Evident As We Serve Others

What are some things that make a person religious? Some might say if you go to church, you are religious. Others might say if you have a belief in something or do something faithfully you are religious. Let's see what James tells us about this in his first chapter in the Bible:

²²Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

The twofold direction God gives us here is to LISTEN and DO. If what we hear does not affect our behavior, he says we deceive ourselves. Does the phrase, “In one ear and out the other” come to mind here? Our actions must speak louder than our words or we can assume that ever so popular title of hypocrite.

James is trying to make the spiritual point here that we need to check ourselves. Aren't we doing that when we look in the mirror like he mentions in verse 23? We look in the mirror to see if everything looks ok with ourselves. If we see something that doesn't look right, we fix it. We not only need to do that in the physical sense, but in the spiritual sense as well.

In verse 25 James talks about the “perfect law”. The perfect law is what God commands and that is to love God and others. James says that whoever looks intently into this perfect law and does not forget what they have heard but does what it says will be blessed in what they do. Is this perfect law always easy to follow, of course it isn't. Sometimes it takes a lot of effort and even more prayer. But God says that whoever looks intently into this perfect law, in other words obeys this law, will be blessed in what they do. There is joy, pleasure, no guilt, and peace when we obey God's law.

Unfortunately, as sinners we cannot do this on our own. But the Gospel assures us that we have forgiveness in times of weakness, when we look at our attitudes and behaviors and see that at times our words have spoken louder than our actions, when what we have heard in church or read in the Bible has gone in one ear and out the other. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection has paid the price for our mistakes, for our weaknesses.

There is always room for spiritual growth in our hearts and in our lives. Let's take to heart God's promises and look intently at God's perfect law. Let's start each day making a promise to ourselves that we will make a conscious effort to go away from sinful ways and do our best to check ourselves in God's mirror and continue to work on fixing what we know is not right. As we put our own desires aside and put others first as God commands us to, may he give us strength and opportunity to truly grow spiritually through him.

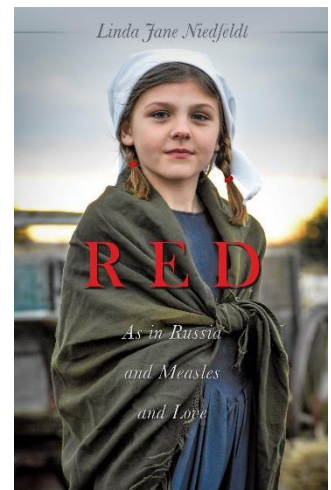
We hope to do more projects like this in our community. If you have any ideas or would like to organize something like this, please talk to Heidi Malley.

Pastor Henry & Judy Koch

Pastor and Judy have been members of Grace since February of 1999 when they transferred from St. John St. Peter in Cleveland, WI., where Pastor served as the church's pastor for 29 years.

Married in June of 1960, they were blessed with 3 children: Susan (Tom) Phelps of Plymouth; Rev. Henry T. (Cynthia) Koch of New Prague, MN, and Katherine (Rev. Phillip) Enderle of Fond du Lac. The Kochs have also been blessed with 8 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.
