Some Final Thoughts from Outgoing Vacancy Pastor David Laabs

Worship: I will be handling the service from now until July 21. I have agreed to complete a basic plan for worship for the first month of Pastor Hennings ministry. It will help him for a smooth transition.

Transition: I have been serving as your vacancy pastor for two years. Obviously there will be a lot of pastoral information that needs to be shared with your new pastor. We have spoken extensively earlier and plan to get together after he has completed his vacation.

Installation: I have spoken with Pastor Phil Henning, your new pastor's father, who will be presiding at the installation. We plan to jointly plan the service and to print the service folder in Grace's office. I would encourage the idea of providing a small choir for the service and would be willing to participate.

Suggestions: We have discussed many things during my two years at Grace. After reflecting on that time and those discussions, I would like to leave you with the following suggestions:

- 1. Please follow through with the discussions we had about seeking outside counsel to determine the focus and mission of the congregation. Pastor Henning will be brand new and I think would appreciate the direction that such an exercise would offer.
- 2. I believe that it would be in the best interest of the congregation and WELS congregations in Manitowoc to have discussions about cooperative ministry in Manitowoc. While the congregations in the city are relatively healthy, there are areas where duplicate ministry could be replaced by additional ministry, particularly outreach to the community.
- 3. I would recommend that you consider having two services, not three, throughout the year. My reasons would be to improve fellowship in the congregation and to avoid instances where there are only a handful of people at a service. The congregation should determine the times.
- 4. After a time of transition to a new pastor, consider taking a critical look at the bylaws of the congregation. The current bylaws place too much responsibility on too few people. With the member ministry program coming online, it is time to get more people involved in meaningful ministry.

It has been a joy to serve you as a vacancy pastor. I have made many new friends and I rejoice with all of you that the Lord has sent you a pastor. I will continue to pray for you and Pastor Henning and I look forward to seeing you in the Manitowoc Community in the future. God bless you all!

Ryan Henning was born in Two Rivers, WI to parents Phil Henning (New Ulm, MN) and Karlene Sonntag (née Kander; Stanton, NE), and was baptized at Our Savior Lutheran Church. Faith and Deeds

When was the last time someone went out of his/her way to do something good for you? I'm sure we can all think of a time when that made a lasting impression on us. What did that act of service mean to you? I'm guessing that you probably felt valued and loved.

I'm sure you've also been on the giving end of this scenario and gone out of your way to do something good for someone else. How did it make you feel to make someone else feel valued and loved? If that person appreciated your kind gesture, I'm willing to bet that you also felt good about helping out.

But what kinds of things might keep us from putting our faith into action and doing something good for others in our workplaces, our neighborhoods, and other parts of our lives? Perhaps we are very busy with activities and our own schedules and agendas. Maybe we just don't really know what people need. Perhaps we're just a little bit selfish.

James tells us in chapter 2 verses 14-17, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and well fed', but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead."

The questions in this reading imply that faith without works is simply no good. Faith and good works need to be interconnected. The lifestyle of a Christian should verify his or her faith, not because it's what we are **supposed** to do, but because our love for Jesus moves us to **want** to do those things. Jesus shines through us as we live out our faith. Jesus himself was a doer and an equipper. His love for others clearly showed in everything he did while he was here on earth. So, too, for us there should be a faith/works balance in our life. We need to **live** out our faith, not just **talk** about it.

James gives us an illustration of the emptiness of words without actions. His illustration echoes Jesus' teaching concerning people who help the needy and people who do not. In Matthew 25:31-46, Jesus taught that not serving people in need is the same as not serving Him, and vice versa. As followers of Christ who seek to honor Him, we are called to serve Christ by serving and ministering to those in need.

1 John 3:16 says, "This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters." Some words we could use to describe love from Jesus' example in this verse might be *selfless, uncomfortable, requires risk*. How does Jesus' example differ from our contemporary notions of love? Many times, we just tend to do what is easy for us, so we could say that Jesus' love is unconditional while ours often times tends to be conditional. When we understand that Jesus came to die and that God gave him for that purpose, that helps us understand God's love for man! Our own children are our most treasured things. We would all do just about anything for our own children because we love them so much! Think, then, how much more our loving Father in heaven must love us! We cannot even begin to wrap our brains around the amount of love our Father has for us individually! It's radical and humbling!

As leaders, we look to put others' needs in front of our won. So, leadership is not about what "others do for me" but what "I do for them." Jesus can work with anyone. After all, his own disciples started out as fishermen. We need to model that and do what we say and what we are asking others to do. May God's example of love for ALL people lead us to love like Jesus' loves!
