"Thanksliving" - A Message from Pastor Laabs

Late October and November are times when the "old farmer" part of me comes out just a little bit. As the green of summer gives way to the golden browns of fall, I am reminded why farmers put in all their work from March through September. It's harvest time! First the corn in the silo, then the beans are harvested and finally the ripe corn. Then I remember the race to get the plowing done before Thanksgiving which usually coincided with the ground freezing. While not everyone plows anymore, every farmer is thankful for a good harvest and if the prices stay reasonable, we'll all have a lot for which to be thankful.

The roots of celebrating a National Day of Thanksgiving go back to a time when much of our national economy was based in agriculture. The timing of the celebration was set to match the harvest time. "Harvest home festivals" were combined with Thanksgiving Day to create the type of Thanksgiving Day we celebrate today.

Two things strike me at Thanksgiving. The first is that, as Christians, we should be very thankful to live in a land that still marks a National Day of Thanksgiving. While it is a national holiday, it is a most appropriate day for Christians to gather to thank God for all his blessings, both spiritual and physical. The second thing that strikes me is how inadequate our giving of thanks really is when we restrict it to one day of the year. God's blessings are "new every morning." We have much for which to be thankful every day!

An unknown hymn writer penned a verse of one of our familiar Thanksgiving hymns that, perhaps, expresses our daily need for giving thanks the best. He wrote:

But best of all your blessings,
The rainbow of your love,
Are all the many mercies
Your Word brings from above.
Our life now has full meaning—
Christ Jesus is our God!
Thanksgiving shall be living
The way the Savior trod.

People over the years have combined the sentiment of the final lines into the word "Thanksliving." It's a wonderful word to describe how we can show our thankfulness to "the Giver of every good and perfect gift" each day of our lives.

Please plan to join your fellow Christians at Grace as we celebrate our National Day of Thanksgiving on Wednesday, November 23, at 6:30 p.m. and again on Thursday, November 24, at 9:00 a.m. It is a good day to invite friends and relatives with whom you may be spending the day. But, above all, it is a good day to thank God and initiate the **Thanksliving** that will follow for the next 364 days.

Member Ministry Corner

Am I Personally Called by God?



One of the Biblical Foundations on which Personal Member Ministry is based says that all Christians are priests and have a ministry or calling. What?? ALL Christians are priests? That's right, all of us! In fact, the apostle Peter says in 1 Peter 2:9, "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light."

We often connect the word "priesthood" to a **professional** ministry rather than an **individual** ministry. We generally think of the pastors as being the ones declaring God's praises, but in fact, God has given this responsibility to all of us. Martin Luther once said, "I would very much like to have this word 'priests' as commonly applied to us as it is customary to call us Christians; for it is all one and the same thing: priests, baptized, Christian."

As priests, Christians have a ministry, a life of Christian service, to perform. Personal ministry is living out, in Christ, the special role God has **prepared for me** and **prepared me for**. And certainly, God would not expect us to do things for which he has not fully equipped us to do. Just as God has given us certain gifts and talents, he will also equip us to use those gifts, and will lead us to those places where he wants us to use them in ways that others will see our faith, in order to help them glorify God as well.

The idea that we are called by God, as priests, should change our perception of our roles in our church and in the community. And although our spiritual gifts differ from one person to the next, man, oh man, should we all consider it such a privilege and blessing to be personally called by our gracious Lord, to serve him, and share his Kingdom with others! Will you answer YOUR call?




Hospitality Team






