During the months of September and October, an analysis of our congregation has been taking place. We are studying congregational feedback given both in written form and from two different open forum meetings held during those months. We are also looking at certain aspects of the total Grace Lutheran Church picture in our Coordinating Council meetings. What follows are some statements based on feedback and self-study. These comments address the strengths we see here at Grace Lutheran, along with weaknesses, opportunities and threats to our congregation.

- Feedback and Self-Study Shows That Our Members' Love for Grace Lutheran is Evident.
- The Obvious Strength of our Congregation Goes Without Saying: The Word of God is preached and taught in its truth and purity!
- Feedback and Self-Study Shows That There is a Love and Support for our Preschool as well as Excitement About Its Potential.
- Feedback and Self-Study Shows That There is a Growing Concern about the Lack of and Losing of Young Families.
- Feedback and Self-Study Shows That We Are Struggling with A Large Decline in Sunday and Monday Church Attendance.
- Self-Study at the Coordinating Council Level Shows a Troubling Budget Shortfall That May Become a Larger Problem Once We are Paying a Full-Time Pastor.

Where do we turn? First, we address the blessings and concerns listed above in prayer to our Loving Lord. For His blessings we thank and praise Him. As to the concerns we ask for His love, guidance and direction trusting He will do what is best for His congregation.

Second, we continue to meet, study and analyze - asking God to be our guide as we do so. We look for ideas regarding outreach, in-reach and ministry. We look for ways to welcome back our straying members. We encourage first fruit giving. We worship regularly – coming to church for Word and Sacrament. We work with Member Ministry asking, "Where might I serve?"

Third, we continue to storm the throne of heaven with prayers asking for a full-time pastor. May God's will be done as we ask Him for a Shepherd!

Changes may be coming! Perhaps we should say changes <u>must</u> come! Get involved! Share your thoughts! Pray for our Lord's love and continue to rejoice in the fact that He loves His congregation of believers at Grace Lutheran Church. May all we do be done for Him and His glory!

# Spiritual Gifts are to be used in Service to God and to Others



Spiritual gifts are divine abilities distributed by the Holy Spirit to every believer according to God's design and grace for the common good of the body of Christ. What is God's desire for us regarding spiritual gifts? He wants us to know what ours are.

There are many different spiritual gifts and they are all given by the Holy Spirit. Just as there are different gifts, there are different ways to serve. But no matter what our spiritual gifts are, God works through our service and through us. It doesn't matter if you are the pastor, serving a meal, teaching Sunday School, planting flowers, or any other act of service. It's in HOW we work, and WHO we are.

The Holy Spirit gives us spiritual gifts not for our own benefit, but for the benefit of others, so that his Kingdom continues to be shared. All spiritual gifts are to be used in love and with Christian motivation. Paul says in 1st Corinthians 13 that if someone is serving without love, it is like a clanging cymbal that gains nothing. In other words, if we serve with the wrong motives, motives that are meant for our own gain, we are not working for God's purpose.

It is a misconception that if we do not have certain gifts we are not part of the church. We cannot compare or compete with others because we are all equally important, no matter what our gifts are. And we need each other whether we think we do or not. We ALL add value in one way or another! And no one person should be trying to do it all. No one is gifted with EVERY spiritual gift. Imagine how exhausting that would be! That is not how God intended it to be.

The Holy Spirit plants interests in us. He gives us an inclination or a willingness to try a particular form of service to others. Part of that encouragement comes from outside of us as well. He places specific opportunities before us to use our gifts. Being asked to serve in some way we have never done before may be the Spirit's way of calling us to a new form of service for which he has equipped us. We need to learn to recognize and respond to the nudging and opportunities placed before us.

We should not just sit and wait until there is a convenient time for us to serve. Life is busy and that "convenient" time may never come. God puts us in the right places at the right times. It's in His time, not ours. So, the next time you are invited to serve, take some time to pray about it and ask God to guide you in the right direction. And then trust that he will!
