A Message to All From Our Staff Minister, Mr. Robert Fink

I would like everyone to know that our Bible study starting in March will be called "Spiritual Questions -- Biblical Answers."

I am hoping that members of Grace will submit questions they have always wondered about, but never received a satisfactory answer. These can be questions about something you've read in the Bible, something someone else believes but we do not teach, a spiritual question you are personally wrestling with, and the like. They can be anything, really. I will do my best to give you an answer from the Bible.

There is a stack of question forms in the gathering area at church where you can write your question and put it into a container marked "**Spiritual Questions -- Biblical Answers.**" I will prepare an answer and make it a topic of discussion in a Bible class. If you cannot get to Bible class, I would gladly email the answer to you. I look forward to hearing from you and – with God's help – answering your Spiritual Questions with a Biblical Answer.

A second thing I want everyone to know is that from now to March 7th the fourth season of the television series called **"The Chosen"** is being shown at the AMC Theatre here in Manitowoc. The schedule is as follows: Episodes 1-3 are shown in one sitting from now until February 14th, episodes 4-6 are shown in one sitting from February 15th to February 28th, and episodes 7-8 are shown in one sitting from February 29th to March 7th.

"The Chosen" is a very well-done portrayal of the life of Jesus. If you have seen any of the episodes from the first three seasons, you know how powerful, thought-provoking and emotional they can be. If you are not familiar with the series, we have DVDs of the first three seasons in our church library. The first three seasons are also available on Netflix and Prime Video.



Forty Days - Our Lenten Journey

Fasting and prayer have been important observances in the lives of the people of God from time immemorial. Often they preceded important events or special revelations from God. Moses fasted for



forty days in preparation for receiving the Ten Commandments from God (Exodus 34). Elijah fled for his life through the wilderness, fasting forty days and nights until he arrived at Mt. Horeb. There God revealed to Elijah his plan for overcoming his enemies. (1 Kings 19). Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert after his baptism where he fasted and prayed for forty days before beginning his mission to redeem the world. (Matthew 4).

Lent is a forty-day period of repentance and renewal that prepares us for Easter. It provides us with a special time to recall the suffering, death and finally the resurrection of our Lord. Lent prepares us for a more meaningful observance of Holy Week and Easter.

Christians have observed Lent ever since the early days of the church. Originally it was a time for emphasizing repentance and baptism. Baptisms were performed in the early church on Easter Eve after a long period of instruction.

The forty-day observance of Lent is still an important part of our corporate life as members of God's family of believers, not just Ash Wednesday, but all forty days. We don't arrange for baptisms any more on Easter Eve, but we still emphasize repentance as an important part of our preparation to celebrate our victory in Christ over sin, death and the grave. And we remember that in our baptism we began a new way of life.

On Ash Wednesday, February 14, we began another pilgrimage with our Savior to Jerusalem. We are going again to a mockery of a trial, to a scene of horrible violence on Calvary, to a funeral, and to recall an unbelievable ending to the greatest story ever told — the resurrection.

We are going on this pilgrimage again to remember and to give thanks for all that God has done for us in Christ. We are going again to renew the relationship with our Lord, begun in our baptism, renewed as we celebrate his victory over our worst enemy.

None of us are scheduled to be baptized on Easter Eve. We've already experienced that. But for these special forty days we want to stay focused on our baptism and what it means for us. **The theme of our midweek Lenten devotions will be "Baptized into His Death.** Each Wednesday we will have an opportunity to focus on our own baptism.

A little girl asked a question when her baby brother was baptized — a neat question that is at the heart of our Lenten pilgrimage. She heard the pastor say, "Receive the sign of the cross on your head and on your heart to mark you as a redeemed child of God." When the ceremony ended she ran to her grandmother, brushed aside her bangs, raised her head and asked, "Is it still there?" That just may be the question we all need to ask ourselves again during Lent. Are you ready and eager to join us on our pilgrimage?

Member Ministry Corner

Do you ever find yourself in charge of a project with a group of people to help? The group might be any size - 2 people, 10 people, or any number of people. There are so many things to do and with the other people on the team, so many hands to get the job done.

However, because you've overseen this project or event several times before, you happen to know everything that needs to be done, where the others may not.

Your job as the leader is to delegate tasks and responsibilities to the others in the group and ensure that the end result is what it is supposed to be.

Your team will need your guidance and direction in order to help. If anything happens to be somewhat complicated, it will take longer to teach them what to do. It might seem easier to just assign simple tasks to others and do all the things that need more explaining, perhaps the more difficult things, yourself.

Rather than spending the time mentoring others so they learn and can do more next time, maybe even lead the team, you just continue to burden yourself with way more than you need to because it just seems easier, and quicker at the time, to do it yourself. By the end of this project, how are you feeling? How do you think those who really could have done more but you did not give them that opportunity are feeling?

Now hold that thought and let's shift our thoughts for a moment to Moses when he was in the wilderness after he had brought the Israelites out of Egypt. At the time, he was serving as judge for ALL the people. The people stood around him from morning till evening bringing their disputes to him to "decide between the parties and inform them of God's decrees and instructions" (from Exodus 18:15-16).

Exodus chapter 18 continues to tell us that it took Moses's father-in-law, Jethro, to come to him and tell him that what he was doing was not good. The workload was too heavy for him and he could not handle it alone. He told Moses to TEACH the people God's decrees and instructions, to SHOW THEM how they were supposed to live and behave. He goes on to tell Moses to SELECT capable men and APPOINT them as officials over others. He should have others SERVE as judges for the cases they could decide themselves and bring only the difficult cases before Moses. Not only would it make Moses's load lighter, but this is what God commands. Not only would Moses then be able to stand the strain, but all the people would go home satisfied too.

OK, let's go back to your project now. How did you feel by the time it was done? I think it's safe to say you were exhausted, burned out, and probably a bit cranky. How do you think the other capable people on the team felt after you did not trust that they could handle the bigger things you took on yourself? They most likely felt undervalued, disappointed, and maybe even a little bored during the planning process because they weren't given much to do. Maybe they were a bit shy not knowing other people on the team and weren't comfortable telling you that they could handle more so they were just waiting for you to ask them, but you didn't!

By not mentoring and teaching others, we may actually be discouraging others. There are so many gifts and talents not just within every church, but out in the world. If we don't explore that as leaders and equip and empower others because we don't want to bother anyone, or think it's just easier to do it ourselves, we are hindering God's command for ALL to serve. And likewise, if leading is not our gift, we do have other gifts to contribute. If we don't step up to help and share the load of others, the capacity of those who do lead and serve will eventually be met and they will become so overwhelmed that they can no longer carry the load.

Let's all do our part as God commands us. Whether that is leading and equipping others to serve or being a helper and part of a team. No matter what part we play, we are all working together to build up the body of Christ, to grow God's Kingdom. And nothing is more valuable than that!



Lisa, Todd, Jacob, and Leah, it's been fun getting to know you better!!









Adam & Melissa Kieselhorst


