GOD'S WORD

You are invited to read each lesson and answer the questions that follow each reading.

FIRST LESSON: Ezekiel 37:1-14

- 1) How does the vision of the dry bones characterize God's people at Ezekiel's time?
- 2) What tool was used to restore life to the dead bones? What is God's encouragement?
- 3) Recall a time when God's life-giving promises encouraged and carried you. Tell someone about this.

PSALM 116 (page 107 in hymnal) - we sing the refrain together and speak the verses responsively

SECOND LESSON: Romans 8:11-19

- 1) Through his Spirit which gives us faith in Christ, God has breathed new life into our mortal bodies. According to these verses, what changes does the Spirit bring about?
- 2) How does a Christian "put to death the misdeeds of the body"?
- 3) Picture a balance scale. On one side list as many "present sufferings" as you can. Then describe how the glory that will be revealed in us will truly tip the scale the other way.

GOSPEL LESSON: John 11:17-27, 38-45

- 1) Find Martha's confession of faith. How do her words sound familiar? When have you said them?
- 2) Find the shortest verse in the Bible in this 11th chapter of John (Hint: It is just before the second half of this reading.) What does this verse say to you about Jesus?
- 3) Read Jesus' prayer in verses 41-42. What benefit did Jesus want for the people standing there with him? How does Jesus' prayer direct your prayers if someone you know gets COVID19?
